**Sacrament of Reconciliation:** At present we are not permitted to celebrate this sacrament in the confessional. If anyone would like to make their confession, please telephone Fr Mark on 01257 460154 and we can arrange to meet outside one of our churches.

Wrap up for Mass. In the coming months we will still need to keep our doors open to allow the air in church to circulate. It is going to feel a bit colder during Mass. We will still keep all our services to under 30 minutes in line with current Covid regulations. If you can please, try to arrive no more than 15 minutes before Mass starts unless you are acting as a steward. It is a help if people fill up from the front benches in both our churches and at St Bede's to use the benches on the right-hand side of the church. This will allow people who arrive in church after you to find a bench near the door. Please remember to keep a one metre + distance from other people when leaving Church. Thank you.

At Masses this weekend we will take a collection for CAFOD's Family Fast Day to help people facing the worst of the coronavirus crisis. We've all felt the impact of this terrible disease – let's come together to help the poorest and most vulnerable people in the world survive, rebuild and heal. **First Holy Communion:** Please keep in your prayers the children who are still waiting to make their First Holy Communion this year, and their families. If you have a child who has now started Year 4 of Primary School and is in a school other than St Bede's or St Chad's please let us know if you would like them to make their Holy Communion in 2021. After consultation with our headteachers we have reluctantly decided to postpone our 2020 First Hoy Communions until May 2021 when we hope things might be a little more "normal" again. Some families have requested a date for this year and we are very happy to make this possible. If you would like your child currently in year 5 to make their First Holy Communion this year under the current restrictions, please call Fr Mark on 01257 460154 and we can make that possible. Thank you.

If you would like to set up a standing order for your weekly offering to your Church, please let us know and we can send you a form that you give to your bank. If you pay tax in the UK and would be prepared to make your weekly offering through Gift Aid, we have forms available to fill in at the back of our churches. #### **Gospel Acclamation**

#### Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus began to speak to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those

who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
