Dear friends,

Our First Reading this Sunday is a piece of very honest poetry from the Book of Job. He cries from the heart that there is no hope and no way out. But the words of the Psalm which we use to respond to what we have heard are the answer in times of anxiety and despair. "Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted." "Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted." The Gospel in just a few words describes a scene we might like to picture in our minds. Great crowds flocking to Jesus because in Him they find hope. He heals. He brings peace. Perhaps you could imagine yourself in the crowd, suddenly finding yourself reaching Jesus, seeing Him face to face. What would you ask Him to do for you? Make your prayer to Him now. He is the one who can heal and bring peace.

The Gospels often show us that Jesus was a man of deep prayer. His actions were directed by His time in prayer. When the disciples find Him in our Gospel passage, He is clear that He cannot just stay where He is. He has to move. Other people need to hear what His Father had sent Him to proclaim. Prayer makes it clear for Him what He has to do.

As a community of disciples our parishes need always to follow the example of Jesus in the way we pray and find our direction from God. Let's continue to pray that our Synod later this year will be a faithful reflection of what God is saying to us. Perhaps God is asking us to move too. The Gospel that has been entrusted to us, must be lived out in a way that proclaims God's love in our world. Please keep this in your prayers, that as individuals and as a community we keep listening, as Jesus did and that the Church we are building together will always be responsive to God's call.

I keep you all daily in my prayers.

Sunday, 7th February, 2021. 5th Sunday of Year B. Readings at Mass

First reading: Job 7:1-4,6-7

Job began to speak: Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service, his time no better than hired drudgery? Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief. Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?' Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!' Restlessly I fret till twilight falls. Swifter than a weaver's shuttle my days have passed, and vanished, leaving no hope behind. Remember that my life is but a breath, and that my eyes will never again see joy.

Second reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-19,22-23

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me.

So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessings.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39



On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them. That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.
