Mass Intentions and our November Pious Lists: Thank you to everyone who has requested Mass to be offered for their intentions at St. Chad's and St. Bede's and for this financial support of your parish. The dates available for Masses are quickly filled and there are no more available in October. November is the Month of Prayer for the Holy Souls so our Masses are offered for those who have died and are named on our Pious List. No dates are available for new Mass intentions until December. We will honour Mass intention requests that have already been handed in for November. December dates can now be booked in both parishes. A new step forward for our Parishes?

CAFOD run a programme called "The *livesimply* award". It is an opportunity for Catholic communities to respond to Pope Francis' invitation in *Laudato Si'* to "work with generosity and tenderness in protecting this world which God has entrusted to us".

What is the *livesimply* award?

It is awarded to communities who can show how they have been living:

- simply
- in solidarity with people in poverty
- sustainably with creation.

Some *livesimply* award communities have encouraged people to walk or cycle to church or school, install solar panels, join a climate change campaign, support Fairtrade stalls or donate to a local food bank. The award celebrates what you have already done and inspires you to do more. It helps your community to live, not just more simply, but also more fully. Some of our parishioners are very keen for us to take part in this programme and to do what we can to be good stewards of the earth and help the most disadvantaged of our brothers and sisters at home and across the world. UN Climate Change Conference (COP26)

The UK will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in Glasgow from 31 October to 12 November 2021. 'COP' means 'conference of parties'. Leaders from 197 countries, including Pope Francis, who have signed up to the UN's climate change treaty, will travel to Glasgow to take part in the conference. This will be the largest gathering of world leaders ever to take place on British soil.

The focus of the conference will be how to keep temperature rises below 1.5C. If the world warms more than this threshold, millions more people in the most vulnerable communities around the globe will suffer from devastating droughts, storms, floods and other impacts of climate change. Governments will be obliged to set out more ambitious goals for ending their contribution to climate change under the Paris Agreement (2015). CAFOD invite us to sign a petition urging the Prime Minister to make sure the communities hardest hit by the climate emergency are listened to at COP26.
