THE NEW PASTORAL PLAN AND ADVENT MONDAYS

The Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan, the fruits of our Synod journey, is promulgated by Archbishop Malcolm on the First Sunday of Advent, just as we start a new liturgical year. As a prayerful way into some of the areas, we are combining our

Advent Mondays' reflections with some aspects of the Pastoral Plan. Even if you are not familiar with the synodal path we have journeyed, the highly topical four themes we picked are *accompaniment, youth and young people, synodality, and structures and property* in service of the mission of the Church. After a very brief input, we will listen to some spontaneous reactions to the questions we have asked our young people at St Julie's Catholic High School, Woolton. Some of the responses are frankly priceless and worth pondering! We will also invite you to share your own reactions to the themes in break-out rooms, and end with a time of prayer and reflection based on a scripture passage linked to the theme and to Advent. We will close each session in a prayerful mood to allow you to continue praying and pondering should you wish to do so even after the hour is over.

New Deaneries come into effect this weekend.

As part of the response to our Synod it has been decided to move to larger deaneries across the Archdiocese. For us, that means that the former deanery of Chorley has now merged with the former deanery of Leyland. Fr Graeme Dunne of St Gregory's parish has been appointed as the Dean. You probably won't notice any change right away but this decision will allow for priests to work together in greater numbers and have more support in times of illness or rest. Also, the priests and lay people across the new deanery will work together to implement the ideas and proposals in our Pastoral Plan in the coming years. It is proposed that there will be a Deanery council of lay people and clergy some time next year to share ideas and arrange events for our people. Some events, such as Services of Reconciliation and Confirmation Programmes will still be organised locally in the Chorley area.

St Chad's Craft and Reading groups are now meeting again


After a long break we are going to hold meetings of the St Chad's Craft and Reading Group's. They will be held in **St Chad's Parish Centre**.

Christmas Cards to the Holy Land.

For many years now St Bede's have supported the Archdiocese of Liverpool Justice and Peace Commission in sending greeting cards to show solidarity with people, parishes and schools in the Holy Land and Jordan. Greeting cards provide a simple but effective way to offer our encouragement, support and prayers to fellow Christians who are suffering isolation or persecution. Knowing that they are not forgotten is very important to them particularly at Christmas. Once again St Bede's has been paired with: St Saviour Church in Jerusalem, Fr Amjad Sabbara and the church of Saint James in Beit Hanina, Rev Nerwan Al-Banna, O.F.M

If you would like to take part, the procedure is quite simple:

1. Please use the Christmas cards provided, or your own if you prefer, making sure that any cards you send are religious and not secular.
2. Write your own personal message in the card, insert one of the Arabic/English greeting slips (if you wish). Write on the envelope either St Saviours or St. James depending on who you have chosen. There is no need to address the envelope. The quickest and surest way to get the cards delivered to the Holy Land is for them to be parcelled up and mailed out together.
3. Please seal the envelope but do not put a stamp on it. Please bring your completed cards to Church and put them in the box in the porch by no later than **Sunday 12th December**.

If you would like to make a small contribution towards postage costs, please leave it in the box with your card. Many thanks for your support.

If a prisoner gets many cards, this focuses attention on them and can result in better treatment, even release. Postcards are also acceptable. A simple message could read: "You are not forgotten - keep strong - we care about you."
